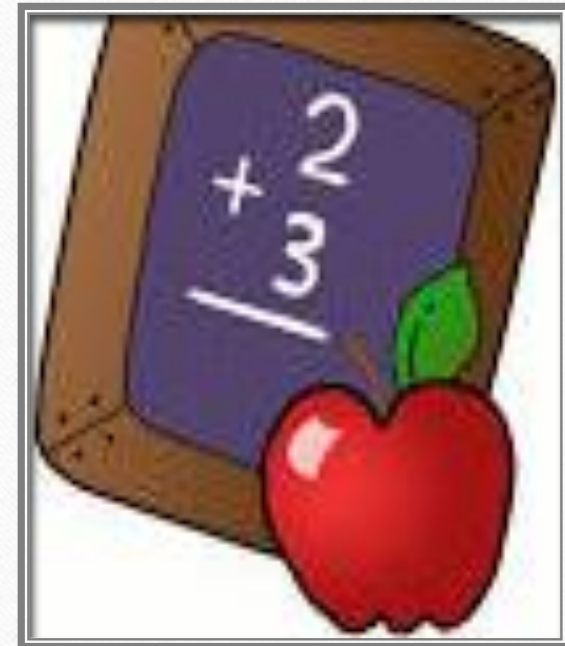

Graduation Requirements: 24 Credits

- 4.0- Credits in English
- 4.0- Credits in Mathematics (Algebra 1, Geometry, and two additional math credits)
- 3.0- Credits in Science (Biology 1, and two of which must have a lab component)
- 3.0- Credits in Social Studies (World History, U.S. History,
1.0- U.S. Government/Economics w/Financial Literacy)
- 1.0- Credit in Physical Education (.5 Personal Fitness/.5 Physical Education)
- 1.0- Credit in Fine Art
- 0.5 Online course – www.flvs.net (can be accessed through the student portal)
- 7.5 Credits in Elective Classes

Other Graduation Requirements

- End of the Course Exams:
 - Geometry, Biology, and U.S. History (30% of the final course grade)
- 2.0 unweighted G.P.A.
- 10 community service hours (Room 4102)
 - Highly recommended 100 hours, or more, for general scholarships and the Bright Futures Scholarship
 - 75 Hours for a Community Service will receive a graduation pin

FSA Algebra 1 End-of-Course Assessment

Students must pass the Algebra 1 EOC assessment graduate with a standard high school diploma and is determined when students complete(d) Algebra 1 or an equivalent course.

The required passing score for the FSA Algebra 1 EOC Assessment based on when first participation in

FSA Algebra 1 EOC Passing Score Spring 2016 and beyond **497** Spring.

Summer Fall or Winter 2015 score **489** (alternate passing score).

Scholar Designation

In addition to meeting the standard high school diploma requirements:

- Earn 1.0 credit in Algebra II
- Earn 1.0 credit in Statistics or an equally rigorous mathematics course
- Pass the Biology I EOC
- Earn 1.0 credit in Chemistry or Physics and another equally rigorous course
- Pass the U.S. History EOC
- Earn 2.0 credits in the same Foreign language
- Earn at least 1 credit in AP or a dual enrollment course

Merit Designation

In addition to meeting the standard high school diploma requirements, students **MUST**:

Obtain one or more industry certification from the list established of courses per 1003.492, F.S.

Superintendent's Diploma of Distinction

This diploma will be awarded to students who meet the requirements of a standard diploma and complete an academically rigorous course requirements including at least four Honors, Advanced Placement, dual enrollment, completion of 75 hours of community service and must earn a 3.5 GPA (weighted scale) by the end of the first semester of the senior year with no final grade less than a "C."

Seal of Biliteracy

The Florida Seal of Biliteracy Program is established to recognize high school graduates who have attained a high level of competency in listening, speaking, reading and writing in one or more foreign languages.

2020-21 Initial Eligibility Requirements (as determined by the Department of Education):

1. Submit the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) no later than August 31 after high school graduation,
2. Complete the 16 college-preparatory courses required for admission to a state university,
 - 4 - English (three must include substantial writing)
 - 4 - Mathematics (at or above the Algebra I level)
 - 3 - Natural Science (two must have substantial laboratory)
 - 3 - Social Science
 - 2 - World Language (sequential, in same language)
3. Achieve the required weighted GPA in the 16 college-preparatory courses per chart below
4. Complete the required number of service hours per chart below, **AND**
5. Achieve the required composite ACT® or combined SAT® score per chart below.

Florida Academic Scholarship Requirements

Florida Medallion Scholarship Requirements

Covers 75% of public-school tuition in FL

- Weighted Bright Futures GPA: 3.00
- 2020-21 Graduates:
 - SAT: 25/ACT: 1210
- 2021-22 Graduates:
 - SAT: 25/ACT: 1210
- 75 hours Service Hours
- 2 - World Language (sequential, in same language)

Requirements to Receive FAS/FMS Award (as determined by the postsecondary institution):

1. Evaluated by Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) as meeting the initial eligibility requirements
2. Graduated with a standard high school diploma or its equivalent
3. Be a Florida resident and U.S. citizen or eligible noncitizen
4. Enroll as a degree- or certificate-seeking student at a Florida institution in at least 6 non-remedial semester credit hours

The student is responsible for tracking application and award status online and ensuring that funding for an academic year is accurate by contacting their institution's financial aid office.
